IMPACT STUDIES ON SPECIAL URBAN PLANNING PROGRAM FOR NORTH SECTOR POSTED ONLINE

Final phase of work

SAINTE-ANNE-DE-BELLEVUE, September 23rd, 2016—The City of Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue’s municipal council is pleased to announce that it will be sharing studies that were done over the past 3 years concerning biological inventories, ecologically valuable areas, and traffic, along with a master plan for the sewer and water main network in its northern sector on the city’s website on September 26th. The studies were conducted as part of the special urban planning program (PPU) for the municipality’s north sector. The posting of these studies comes after the May 2015 information session on the potential development scenario, which was aimed at presenting the general philosophy and plan of the PPU project to residents while also listening to residents’ concerns.

According to Paola Hawa, Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue’s mayor, “ninety percent of the work on the PPU has now been completed. We want to take residents’ comments into account before concluding the exercise. We have a duty to respect our commitment to take a new thoughtful and responsible approach, which is why we have been including residents at every stage of the process.”

Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue residents are invited to read the results of the studies to get a clear picture of the impacts of development in the north sector. They will then be invited to a public information session on the PPU for this sector on October 12th.
